There are also several maps and charts, as well as a comprehensive list of biblical quotations and allusions. The editorial material is informed by contemporary biblical and historical scholarship; while it deals forthrightly with both the strengths and weaknesses of the narrative, it nevertheless treats the Book of Mormon as a sacred text, worthy of careful study and respect.

There are answers to the concerns raised by the CES Letter, and those answers can be supported by current scholarship as well as harmonized with the acceptance of Mormon truth claims.
